O.G. 3.1
UNIFORM REGULATIONS, WORK (Summer-Winter) AND DRESS

Formal uniforms are optional. If a firefighter chooses to provide their own uniform, District guidelines must be followed.

The District will provide T-shirts to all active members. Some form of department gear is required on all calls and at all drills.

A Class B Uniform will be provided to firefighter's attending EMT school.

Class B Uniform:

Firefighters:

Navy Blue, work pants and shirt with patch on left sleeve.

Officers:

Navy Blue work pants and Light Blue work shirt

Black shoes and belt.

The Class B uniform will be worn during all inspections such as smoke detector inspections, demonstrations and all business involved in the presence of the public.

The Department patch shall be worn on the left shoulder of all Class B uniform shirts and work coats with the option for "EMT" patch may be worn on the right shoulder.

T Shirts:

- Will be allowed under the following conditions:
 - They will be short sleeve Navy Blue, good quality and good condition with Kangley-Palmer Fire Dept. logo

Sweat Shirts:

Fire Department jackets are optional, and are provided to EMTs. They shall be navy blue (bomber style) with a King County Fire Protection District #47 patch on the left sleeve, proper EMS patch (if authorized) on the right sleeve, name tag above the right pocket. No other patches are authorized.

DEPARTMENT SHOULDER PATCH

Department shoulder patches are part of the official uniform and are to be worn only on official uniform items.

The patch is worn on the left sleeve with the patch centered at the top of the sleeve one inch down from the seam.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SHOULDER PATCH

EMS shoulder patches are part of the official uniform and are to be worn only on official uniform items.

The patch is worn on the right sleeve with the patch centered at the top of the sleeve one inch down from the seam.

The EMS patch will be worn only by those so authorized. The EMS level will be indicated by either an, EMT, or Paramedic patch.

DEPARTMENT IDENTIFICATION CARD

The Department will issue all members identification cards after completion of recruit training. The Department ID card should be carried at all times.

The identification card will not be used to gain entry into events or activities except in an official capacity to conduct Department business.

The identification card is property of the Department and will be surrendered upon termination or leaving the organization.
